This hands-on exercise brings your training to life and lets you practice decision-making where it matters most. 1. Explain the unique role of fire police in the National TIM framework and how their presence influences scene safety, traffic flow, and responder protection.
2. Demonstrate best practices for manual traffic control in high-risk environments, including flagging techniques, cone deployment, and communication protocols.
3. Apply "first 15 minutes" strategies for establishing safe zones, initial command, and early interagency coordination at roadway incidents.
4. Identify common hazards and behavioral risks to fire police personnel and describe steps to mitigate them using real-world case studies and data.
5. Communicate effectively with fire/rescue, law enforcement, and DOT partners during rapidly evolving incidents.
